**GRK 100 Why study Greek?** *If the English of the King James Bible was good enough for the Apostle Paul, why do we need to study Greek? Why exactly should we bother with the study of Greek? Some of the benefits from the study of biblical Greek are: (1) making sense of the information that Bible software shows (2) finding what the Greek words mean (3) seeing the author's flow of thought and his central message (4) reading good commentaries and using other biblical tools that make use of Greek.
